Kim Redigan is a Meta Peace Team nonviolence trainer and peace educator. She has served on many domestic and international peace teams, including teams in the West Bank, Egypt, and as of next week, Mexico, where she will join five other women in Tijuana to offer violence reduction trainings and unarmed civilian protection. She is the vice-chair of Michigan Coalition for Human Rights. She teaches theology at University of Detroit Jesuit High School and Academy, and is inspired by Catholic Social Teaching. She is on the State Council of Pax Christi Michigan and one of the organizers of a weekly immigrant solidarity vigil in Southwest Detroit. She received a Master's degree in Religious Studies from Detroit Mercy and an MA in Social Justice from Marygrove College.

Working with Meta Peace Team, Elliott Adams has been to Palestine 4 times (as recent as June-July 2018) as well as to Gaza, Standing Rock and most recently the Mexican border (December 2018). Elliott Adams started pursuing peace by volunteering for and serving in Vietnam and then Japan and Korea. This showed him that war does not create peace, does not solve conflicts, and does not create national security. So he moved from soldier to nonviolent warrior. This activism for simple human justice has taken him from the Atlantic to the Pacific and from Mexico to Canada, from testifying before US Congress Judiciary Committee and attending Parliament in Canada to engaging in civil disobedience for the cause many times.
