Admission Requirements

An applicant must meet University of Detroit Mercy's entrance requirements for this program and have completed a baccalaureate or advanced degree from a regionally accredited college or university with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better. Additional prerequisites may be required.

Degree Requirements

A degree candidate for the Master of Arts in Economics must successfully complete a minimum of 30 credit hours of required graduate-level Economics courses.

Note: A student completing a B.A. in Economics or Financial Economics from University of Detroit Mercy may not repeat an equivalent graduate course without the consent of the advisor or chairperson.
