advice to low-income immigrants to educate and empower the clients.


· UDM students will meet with residents of the Haven Domestic Violence Shelter and will develop an education and awareness program.

The Step Up: Be A Leader and Pay It Forward program is multi-faceted and engages UDM Emerging Leaders in providing group mentoring and social skills building sessions to help local high school students transition to college. The high school students then "Pay It Forward" by sharing the same skills with local junior high school students. Topics include stress and time management, proper use of social media, techniques for reducing aggression, prejudice, and substance abuse, and helping students "step up" during an emergency or when others are in need of help. Participating schools include the Jalen Rose Leadership Academy, Loyola, University of Detroit Jesuit, Bishop Foley Catholic, and Hamtramck High Schools.





The **Leadership Minor** is the largest and fastest growing Minor on campus. January 2015 will mark the second anniversary of this academic program and 130 students have currently declared the minor and are enrolled in leadership courses.
