For the University assessment process, the Counseling program learning outcomes are assessed each year beginning in February for the previous calendar year and are collectively assessed and comprehensively reviewed every four years. Student assessment data related to knowledge, skills and professional dispositions is collected on all students as part of the Annual Student Performance Evaluation as well as during the Internship using the Internship Supervisor Evaluation of Intern.

Counseling students demonstrate ethical conduct and compliance with the prevailing standards of practice. Counseling students are assessed during the Counseling Internship from the Internship Site Supervisor Evaluation rubric. All students must demonstrate ethical conduct with a rating of “Good” or above, receive a B or better in the Internship, and successfully complete the Counseling program. Data is also collected in Annual Student Performance Evaluations. Data collected is regularly reviewed by Counseling faculty annually as part of the Counseling program evaluation and annual report process.
